The Boros Collection by Karen and Christian Boros comprises groups of works by international artists dating from 1990 to the present. THE FEUERLE COLLECTION

The Feuerle Collection located in a former WW II telecommunications bunker hosts early Imperial Chinese stone, wood and lacquer furniture and Chinese scholar furniture from the Han Dynasty to the early Qing Dynasty, from 200 BC to the 17th C, juxtaposed with early Khmer sculptures from the 7th to the 13th C, and international contemporary art by Zeng Fanzhi, Nobuyoshi Araki, Anish Kapoor, James Lee Byars, Cristina Iglesias and Adam Fuss. The Feuerle Collection is the only place in the world hosting a contemporary version of the Imperial Chinese Incense Ceremony (by Appointment only).
